Recognizing Child Care Providers as Early Relational Health Professionals

Location: Sauganash Ballroom

Early Relational Health (ERH) is an emerging concept that organizes the cumulative understanding of the relational foundation of children's and adults' health and well-being. Unlike earlier research talking points that drove policy and program work (for example: brain science, return on investment, word gap), the vision of ERH is inclusive (not limited to any one profession), reciprocal (caring for both the child and the adult) and fundamentally rooted in the relational human experiences. Can we recognize child care as an essential part of the early relational experiences for children and their families? Can we lift up our providers as early relational health professionals alongside disciplines like pediatrics, home visiting, mental health and others? Does it matter? This presentation is an invitation to explore these questions in the context of child care leadership and advocacy work.



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






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
