# Purpose

- To clarify the role and scope of practice of community-based child care resource organizations and state child care resource networks.
- To support policymakers and child care resource organizations and practitioners in determining, advocating for, and investing in comprehensive, integrated CCR&R strategies.

# What the Position Statement Does

- Incorporates new branding and value proposition.
  - Defines distinct roles of community-based child care resource organizations and state networks.
  - Asserts that **every state** needs a **well-resourced, community-based CCR&R** and **state network** with an ambitious but achievable vision for both.
  - Asserts **community-based CCR&R** must be:
    - Full-service solutions
    - Grounded in community
    - Mission-focused for the public good
  - Makes the case for **comprehensive, integrated solutions** that promote **access for every child, family, and community**.
  - Distinguishes and describes “**core**” and **optional services**—focused on results.
  - Recommends **actions for policymakers, state administrators, business & community leaders, and CCR&Rs**.
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# Community Input Process

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## Effective CCR&Rs:

- Offer full service solutions for communities, impacting all parts of the child care system. They build the supply and quality of child care, grow the child care workforce, help families and business solve their child care challenges, and deliver on-the-ground information and solutions.
  - Are grounded in community, respecting and honoring culture, building trust, and understanding needs and strengths.
  - Are mission focused for the public good, offering accessible and inclusive services for everyone.
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# Community-Based CCR&R Services

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## Core Services

- Support family choice in child care services
- Build supply, quality, and diversity of child care options
- Grow and sustain a skilled child care workforce
- Provide real world data to inform community decision-making
- Influence policy and regulations, and help build solutions

## Additional Services

- Deliver services for business and communities
- Foster children's healthy development
- Help families afford child care
- Support families in caring for their children



**America has a broken child care system that is holding us back. Community-based child care resource and referral organizations and state networks turn a uneven patchwork of resources into a system that drives equitable access to inclusive, quality child care options for everyone.**

- **Full-Service Solutions:** Conduct activities that promote and ensure productive relationships with other state-level organizations and leaders to identify and develop strategies to address gaps and coordination, equitable access, and public policy and funding concerns.
  - **Statewide Coordination:** State networks coordinate with, gather data from, and support all community-based CCR&Rs within the state, enabling them to understand the full-range of child care conditions across the state.
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# State Network Services

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## Core Services

- Promote use of best practices statewide
- Provide real-world child care data
- Support statewide awareness of and access to CCR&R Services
- Influence policy and regulations and help build Solutions

## Additional Services

- Ensure consistent services statewide
- Evaluate effectiveness of services
- Deliver direct services to families, child care providers, and/or businesses
- Provide real-world data to understand and grow the child care workforce

# Recommendations

## Organizations delivering CCR&R services

- Develop trusting relationships with state child care administrators and policymakers by focusing on solutions, delivering results, and finding common ground.
- Demonstrate impact by negotiating contracts and grants that lay out clear, impactful, and responsive deliverables aligned to the appropriate level funding and staffing necessary to achieve them. Measure and report on how work is making a difference within a community or state.
- Demonstrate data expertise by providing relevant, unbiased, reliable, and up-to-date data and reports for families, providers, policymakers, and community stakeholders.
- Evaluate and align your organization's policies, practices, and staff to reflect the many needs and populations you serve and contribute to better access to high-quality child care for all young children and families.
- Hold your organization responsible for promoting and operating programs that recognize the distinct needs of communities in rural areas, that are under-resourced.
- Proactively contribute to community and policy development and decision-making and advocate for targeted investments and improved policies informed by the communities you partner with and serve.
