Child Care Aware of America's recent report Demanding Change: Repairing our Child Care System found that in 2020 in Kentucky:

In Kentucky, the median income for a single-parent family is \$23,104, which means center-based child care for an infant would use 33% of family median income.

In Kentucky, the median income for a married couple is \$86.059, which means center-based child for an infant would use 9% of family median income.



Compared to tuition and housing...



In Kentucky, the average price of infant care in a center-based program is 31.15% less than the average tuition and fees at an in-state, four-year public university.



In Kentucky, the average price for two children in center-based child care is **57.44% more** than the average annualized rent cost and 1.97% more than the average annualized mortgage cost.
