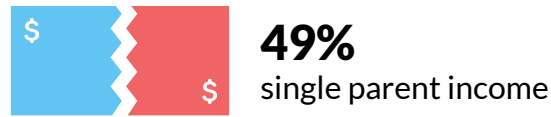


Child Care Affordability in MICHIGAN

Child Care Aware of America's recent report Demanding Change: Repairing our Child Care System found that in 2020 in Michigan:

In Michigan, the median income for a single-parent family is \$26,515, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **49%** of family median income.



In Michigan, the median income for a married couple is \$96,983, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **13%** of family median income.

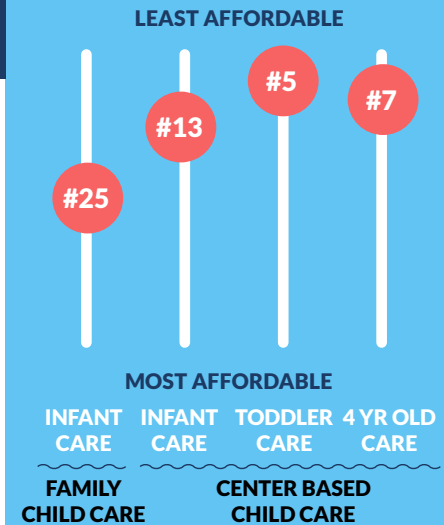

When ranked among other states on the affordability of care:



Compared to tuition and housing...



In Michigan, the average price of infant care in a center-based program is **7.03% less** than the average tuition and fees at an in-state, four-year public university.



In Michigan, the average price for two children in center-based child care is **130.24% more** than the average annualized rent cost and **54.50% more** than the average annualized mortgage cost.
