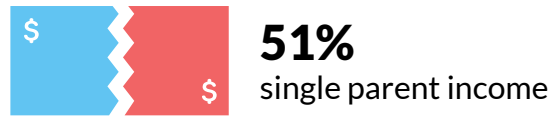


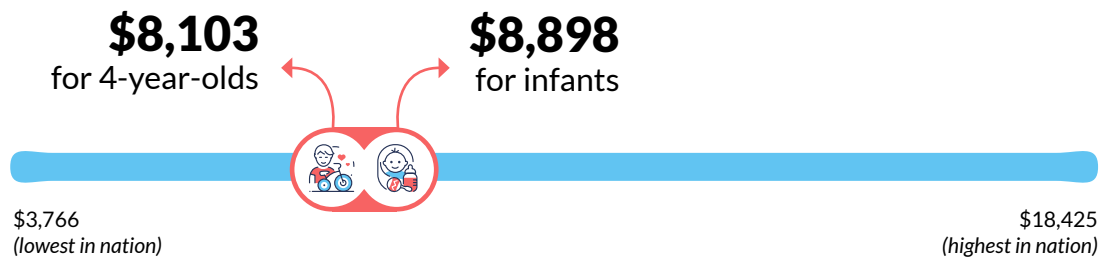
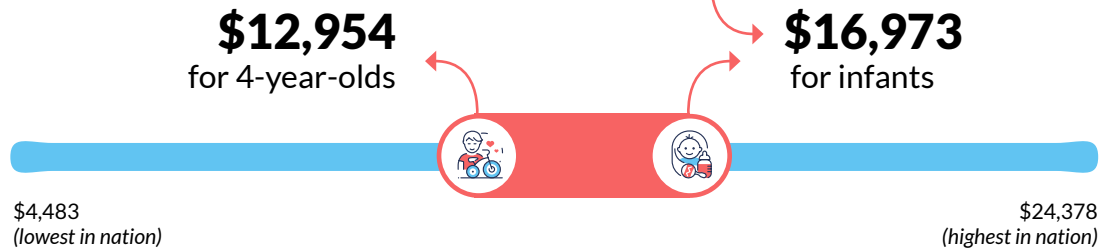
Child Care Affordability in MINNESOTA

Child Care Aware of America's recent report **Demanding Change: Repairing our Child Care System** found that in 2020 in Minnesota:

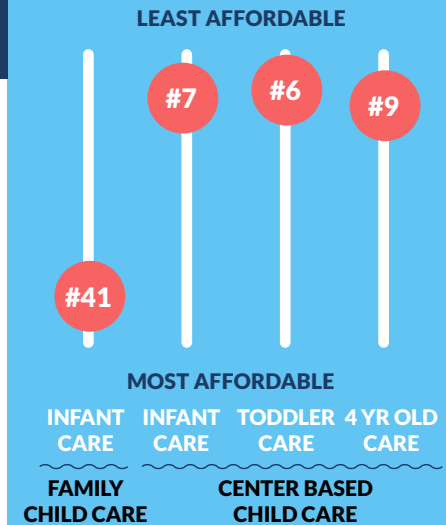
In Minnesota, the median income for a single-parent family is \$33,474, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **51%** of family median income.



In Minnesota, the median income for a married couple is \$114,765, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **15%** of family median income.



When ranked among other states on the affordability of care:



Compared to tuition and housing...



In Minnesota, the average price of infant care in a center-based program is **42.15%** more than the average tuition and fees at an in-state, four-year public university.



In Minnesota, the average price for two children in center-based child care is **155.26%** more than the average annualized rent cost and **57.84%** more than the average annualized mortgage cost.
