
## Child Care Affordability in MONTANA

## Child Care Aware of America's recent report **Demanding Change: Repairing our Child Care** System found that in 2020 in Montana:



In Montana, the median income for a single-parent family is \$25.865, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **40%** of family median income.


In Montana, the median income for a married couple is \$89.296, which means center-based child for an infant would use 12% of family median income.

Compared to tuition and housing...



In Montana, the average price of infant care in a center-based program is **40.54% more** than the average tuition and fees at an in-state, four-year public university.



In Montana, the average price for two children in center-based child care is 103.0% more than the average annualized rent cost and **15.10% more** than the average annualized mortgage cost.
