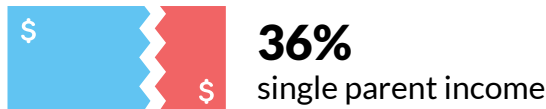


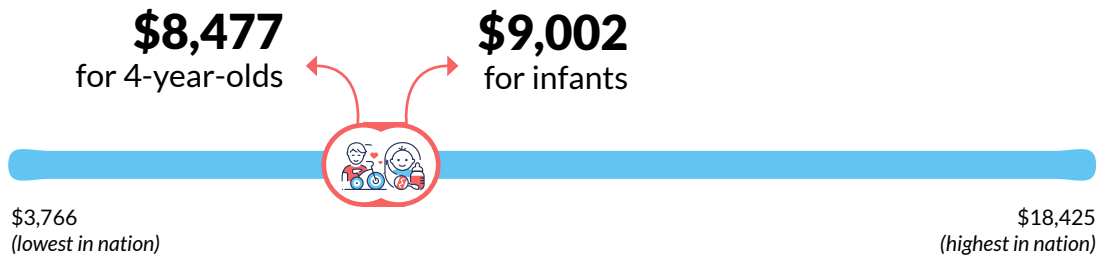
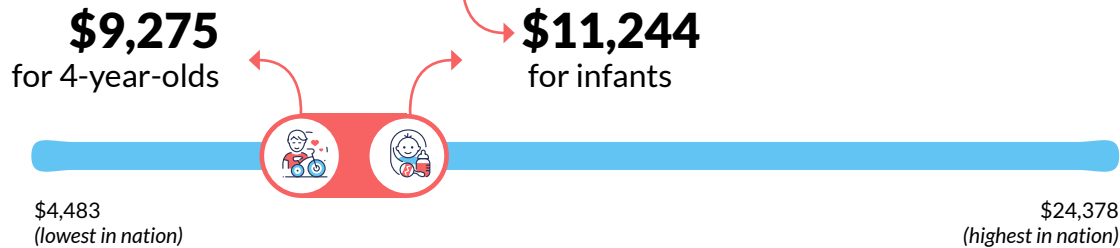
Child Care Affordability in NEVADA

Child Care Aware of America's recent report Demanding Change: Repairing our Child Care System found that in 2020 in Nevada:

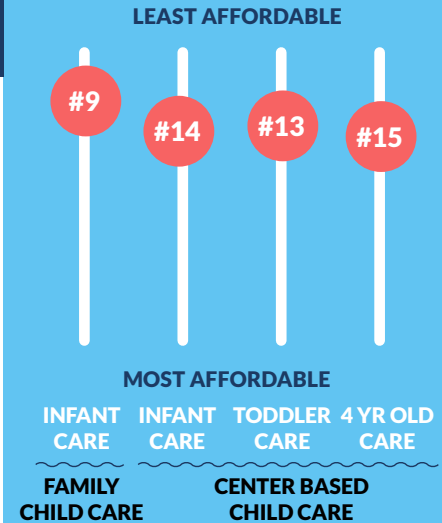
In Nevada, the median income for a single-parent family is \$31,641, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **36%** of family median income.



In Nevada, the median income for a married couple is \$85,873, which means center-based child for an infant would use **13%** of family median income.



When ranked among other states on the affordability of care:



Compared to tuition and housing...



In Nevada, the average price of infant care in a center-based program is **35.63% more** than the average tuition and fees at an in-state, four-year public university.



In Nevada, the average price for two children in center-based child care is **54.46% more** than the average annualized rent cost and **12.20% more** than the average annualized mortgage cost.
