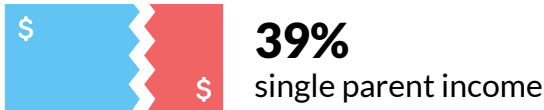


# Child Care Affordability in

# NEW HAMPSHIRE

*Child Care Aware of America's recent report Demanding Change: Repairing our Child Care System found that in 2020 in New Hampshire:*

In New Hampshire, the median income for a single-parent family is \$34,976, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **39%** of family median income.



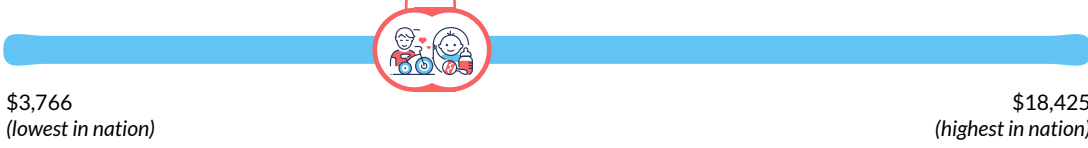
In New Hampshire, the median income for a married couple is \$119,313, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **11%** of family median income.



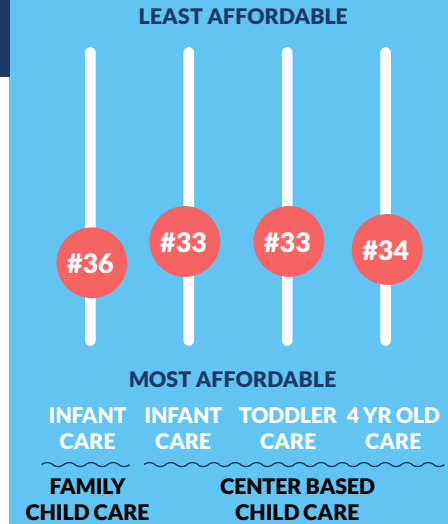
**\$11,114** for 4-year-olds

When ranked among other states on the affordability of care:



Compared to tuition and housing...



In New Hampshire, the average price of infant care in a center-based program is **19.76% less** than the average tuition and fees at an in-state, four-year public university.



In New Hampshire, the average price for two children in center-based child care is **85.44% more** than the average annualized rent cost and **5.76% more** than the average annualized mortgage cost.
