
In New Jersey, the median income for a single-parent family is \$33.541, which means center-based child care for an infant would use 49% of family median income.



In New Jersey, the average price of infant care in a center-based program is 14.54% more than the average tuition and fees at an in-state, four-year public university.



In New Jersey, the average price for two children in center-based child care is **86.39% more** than the average annualized rent cost and **0.87% more** than the average annualized mortgage cost.
