Child Care Aware of America's recent report Demanding Change: Repairing our Child Care System found that in 2020 in New Mexico:

In New Mexico, the median income for a single-parent family is \$24,293, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **39%** of family median income.

In New Mexico, the median income for a married couple is \$78,803, which means center-based child for an infant would use **12%** of family median income.







Compared to tuition and housing...



In New Mexico, the average price of infant care in a center-based program is **18.07% more** than the average tuition and fees at an in-state, four-year public university.



In New Mexico, the average price for two children in center-based child care is **81.21% more** than the average annualized rent cost and **19.49% more** than the average annualized mortgage cost.
