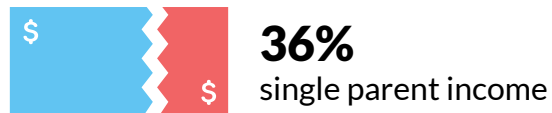


Child Care Affordability in

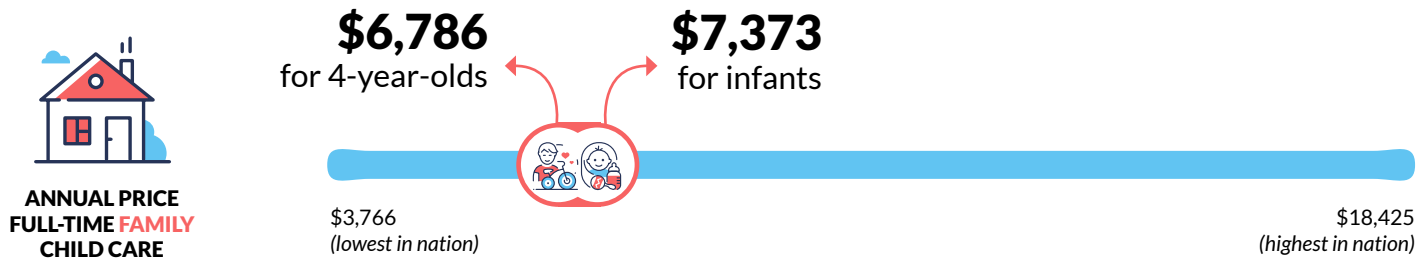
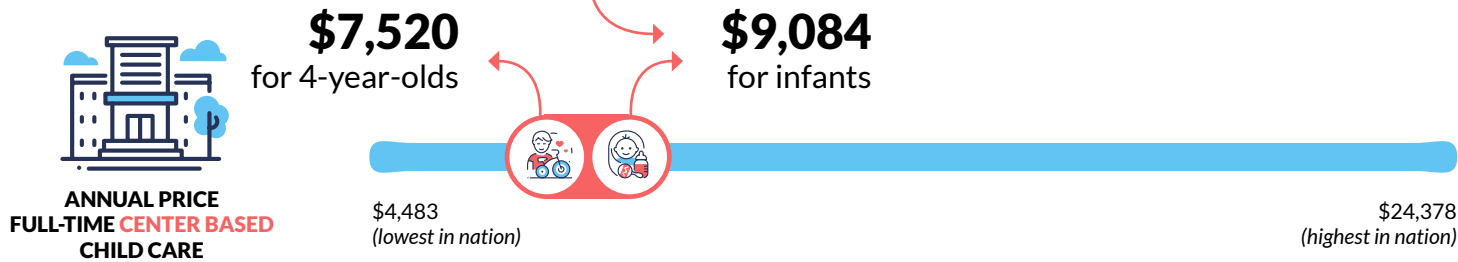
Child Care Aware of America's recent report Demanding Change: Repairing our Child Care System found that in 2020 in Oklahoma:



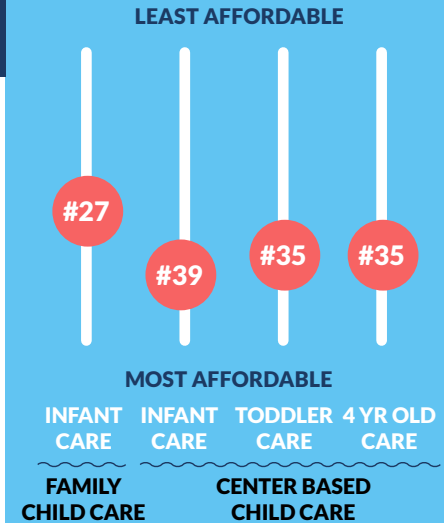
In Oklahoma, the median income for a single-parent family is \$25,178, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **36%** of family median income.



In Oklahoma, the median income for a married couple is \$82,503, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **11%** of family median income.



When ranked among other states on the affordability of care:



Compared to tuition and housing...



In Oklahoma, the average price of infant care in a center-based program is **1.27% more** than the average tuition and fees at an in-state, four-year public university.



In Oklahoma, the average price for two children in center-based child care is **70.82% more** than the average annualized rent cost and **12.13% more** than the average annualized mortgage cost.
