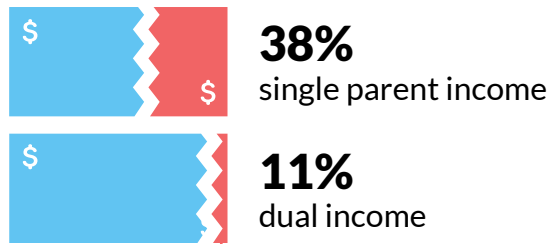


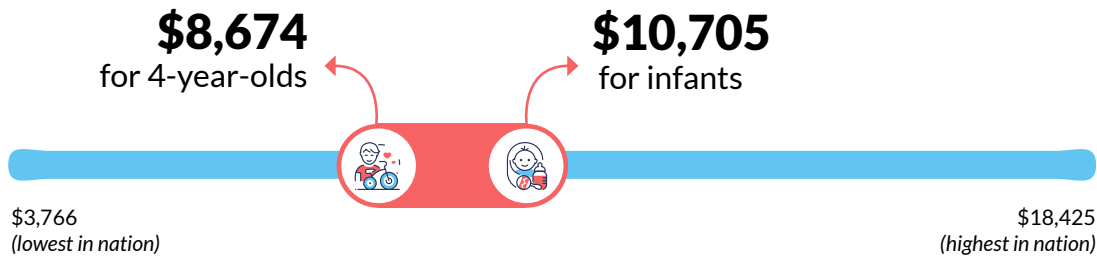
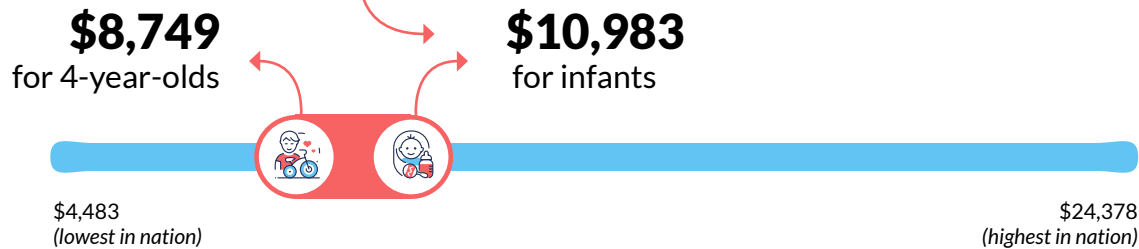
Child Care Affordability in OREGON

Child Care Aware of America's recent report **Demanding Change: Repairing our Child Care System** found that in 2020 in Oregon:

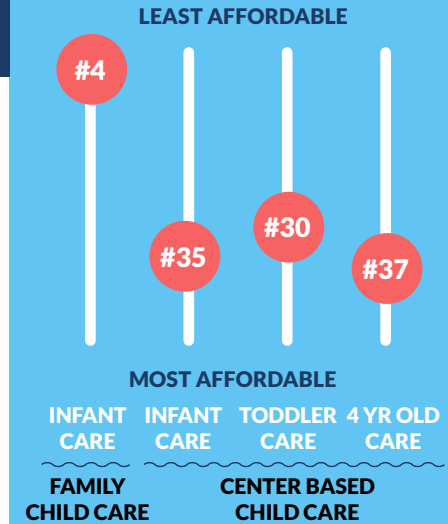


In Oregon, the median income for a single-parent family is \$29,124, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **38%** of family median income.

In Oregon, the median income for a married couple is \$96,745, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **11%** of family median income.



When ranked among other states on the affordability of care:



Compared to tuition and housing...



In Oregon, the average price of infant care in a center-based program is **7.47% less** than the average tuition and fees at an in-state, four-year public university.



In Oregon, the average price for two children in center-based child care is **48.14% more** than the average annualized rent cost and **3.22% less** than the average annualized mortgage cost.
