Child Care Aware of America's recent report Demanding Change: Repairing our Child Care System found that in 2020 in Rhode Island:

In Rhode Island, the median income for a single-parent family is \$30,482, which means center-based child care for an infant would use 45% of family median income.

In Rhode Island, the median income for a married couple is \$109,110, which means center-based child for an infant would use 13% of family median income.





Compared to tuition and housing...



In Rhode Island, the average price of infant care in a center-based program is **1.10% more** than the average tuition and fees at an in-state, four-year public university.



In Rhode Island, the average price for two children in center-based child care is **111.49% more** than the average annualized rent cost and **14.16% more** than the average annualized mortgage cost.
