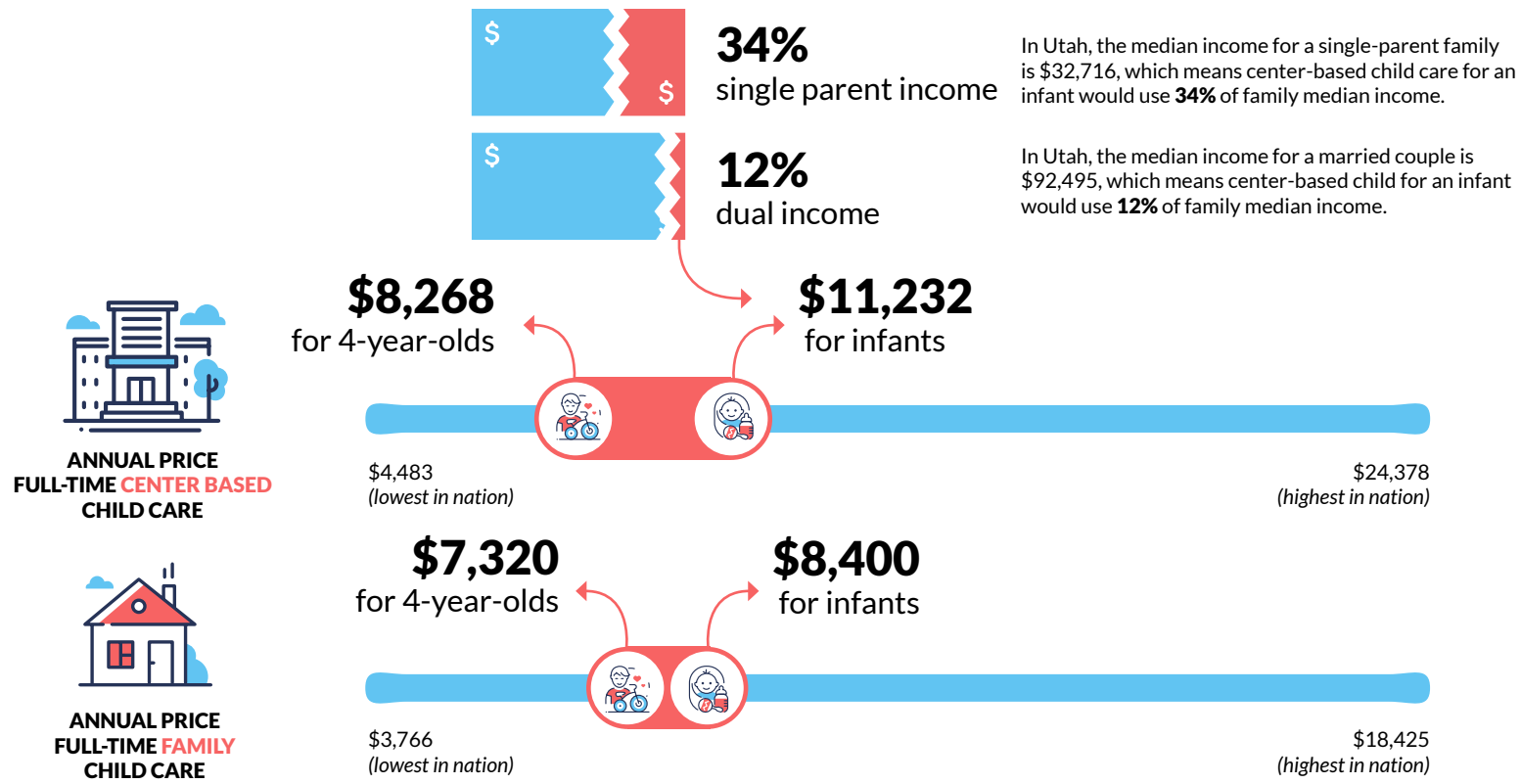


Child Care Affordability in

UTAH

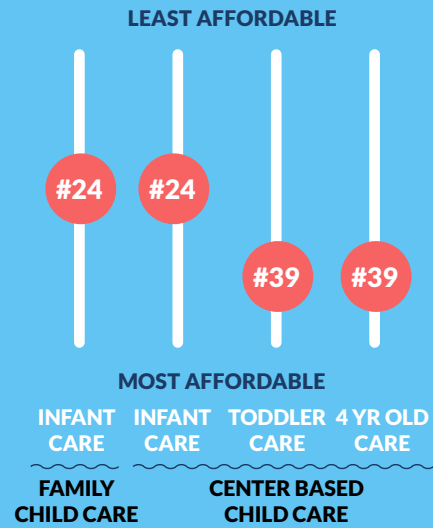
Child Care Aware of America's recent report Demanding Change: Repairing our Child Care System found that in 2020 in Utah:



In Utah, the median income for a single-parent family is \$32,716, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **34%** of family median income.

In Utah, the median income for a married couple is \$92,495, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **12%** of family median income.

When ranked among other states on the affordability of care:



Compared to tuition and housing...



In Utah, the average price of infant care in a center-based program is **54.92% more** than the average tuition and fees at an in-state, four-year public university.



In Utah, the average price for two children in center-based child care is **56.70% more** than the average annualized rent cost and **4.77% more** than the average annualized mortgage cost.
