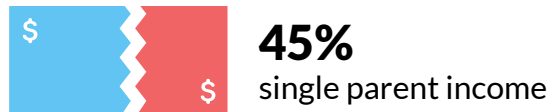


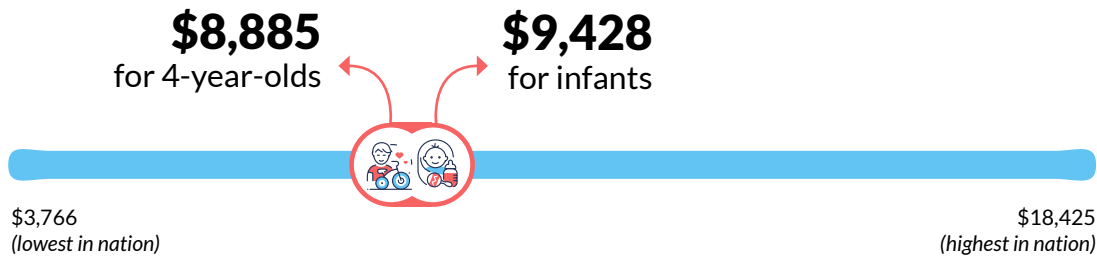
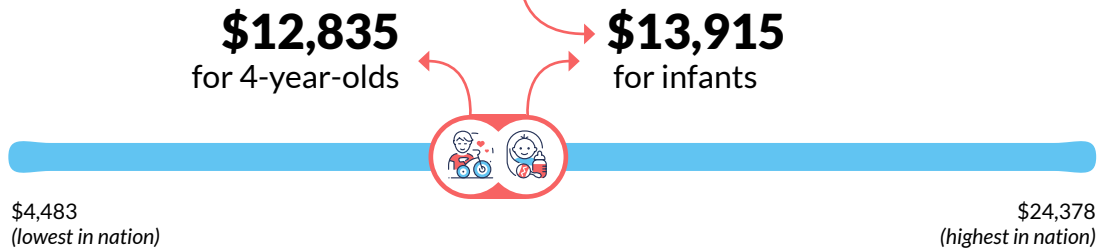
Child Care Affordability in VERMONT

Child Care Aware of America's recent report Demanding Change: Repairing our Child Care System found that in 2020 in Vermont:

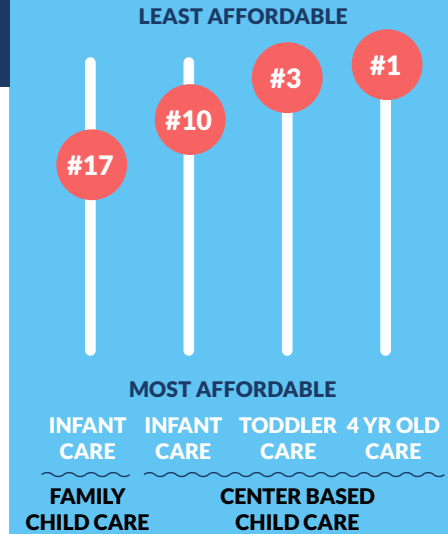
In Vermont, the median income for a single-parent family is \$30,866, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **45%** of family median income.



In Vermont, the median income for a married couple is \$99,985, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **14%** of family median income.



When ranked among other states on the affordability of care:



Compared to tuition and housing...



In Vermont, the average price of infant care in a center-based program is **91.93% more** than the average tuition and fees at an in-state, four-year public university.



In Vermont, the average price for two children in center-based child care is **126.31% more** than the average annualized rent cost and **37.52% more** than the average annualized mortgage cost.
