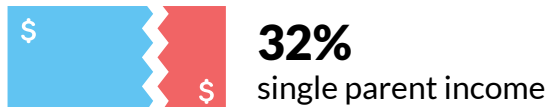


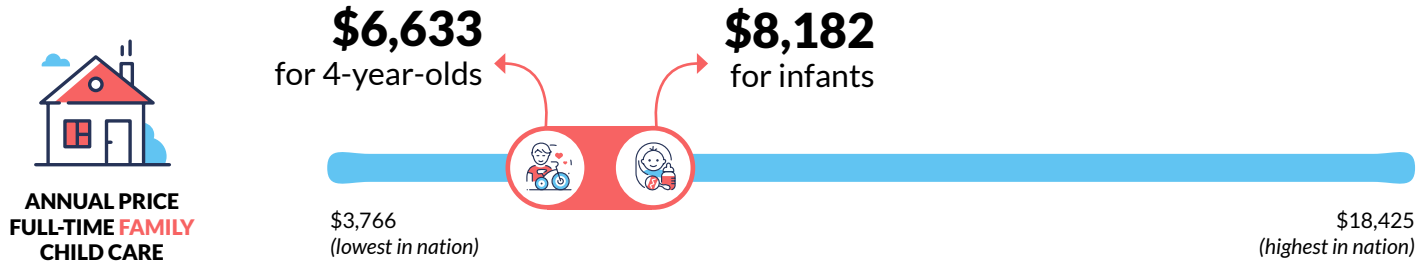
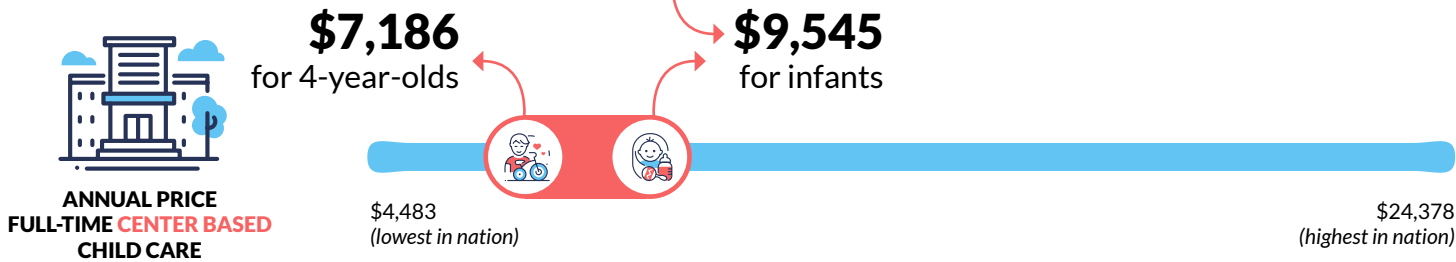
# Child Care Affordability in FLORIDA

## Child Care Aware of America's recent report Demanding Change: Repairing our Child Care System found that in 2020 in Florida:

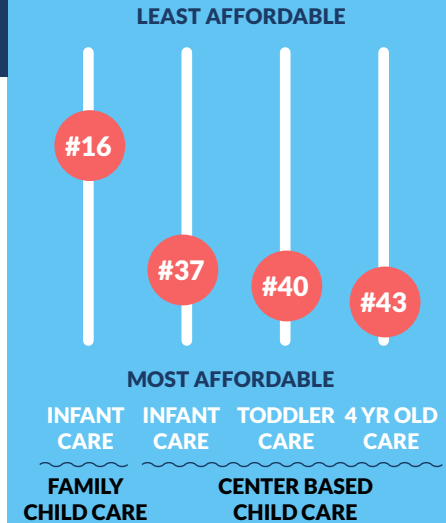
In Florida, the median income for a single-parent family is \$29,625, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **32%** of family median income.



In Florida, the median income for a married couple is \$86,244, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **11%** of family median income.



When ranked among other states on the affordability of care:



Compared to tuition and housing...



In Florida, the average price of infant care in a center-based program is **49.84% more** than the average tuition and fees at an in-state, four-year public university.



In Florida, the average price for two children in center-based child care is **18.66% more** than the average annualized rent cost and **7.24% less** than the average annualized mortgage cost.
