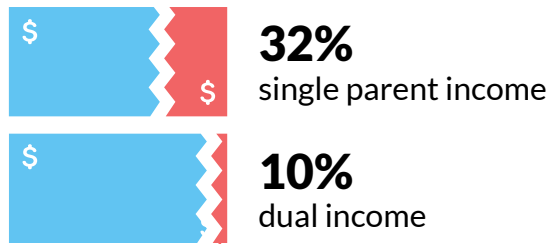


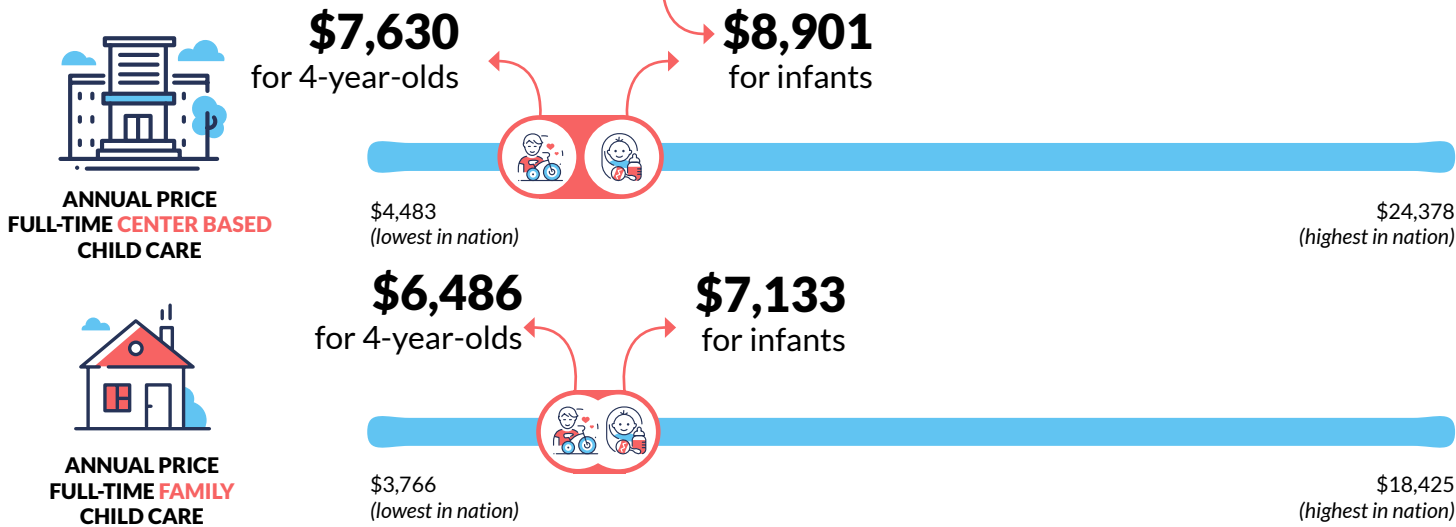
Child Care Affordability in GEORGIA

Child Care Aware of America's recent report
**Demanding Change: Repairing our Child Care
System** found that in 2020 in Georgia:



In Georgia, the median income for a single-parent family is \$27,539, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **32%** of family median income.

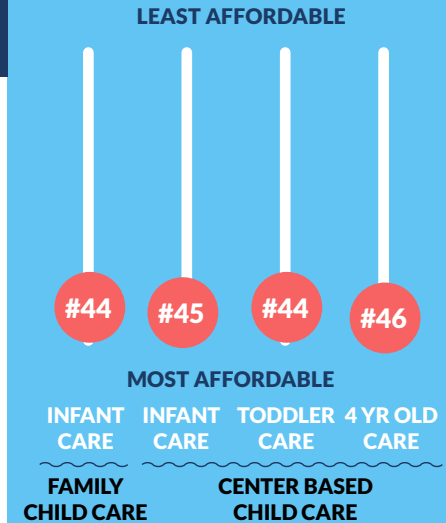
In Georgia, the median income for a married couple is \$93,267, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **10%** of family median income.

When ranked among other states on the affordability of care:



Compared to tuition and housing...



In Georgia, the average price of infant care in a center-based program is **1.26% more** than the average tuition and fees at an in-state, four-year public university.



In Georgia, the average price for two children in center-based child care is **36.94% more** than the average annualized rent cost and **2.78% less** than the average annualized mortgage cost.
