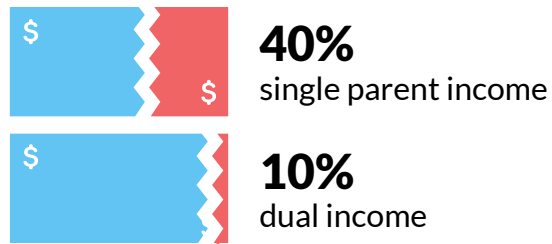


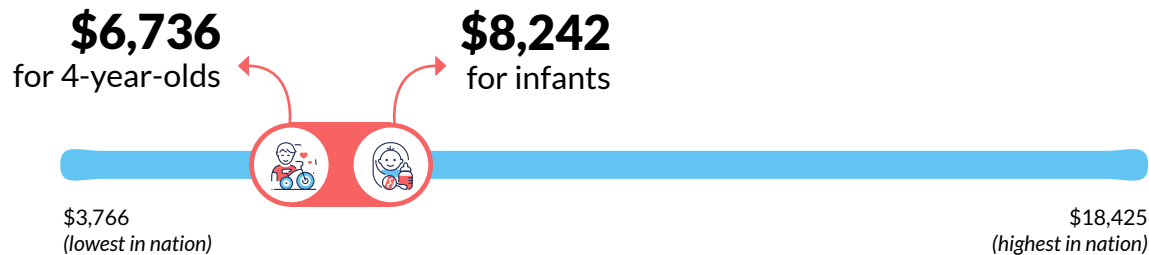
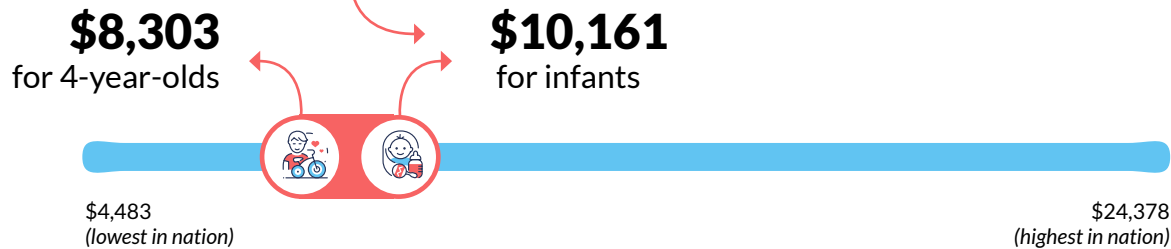
Child Care Affordability in OHIO

Child Care Aware of America's recent report Demanding Change: Repairing our Child Care System found that in 2020 in Ohio:

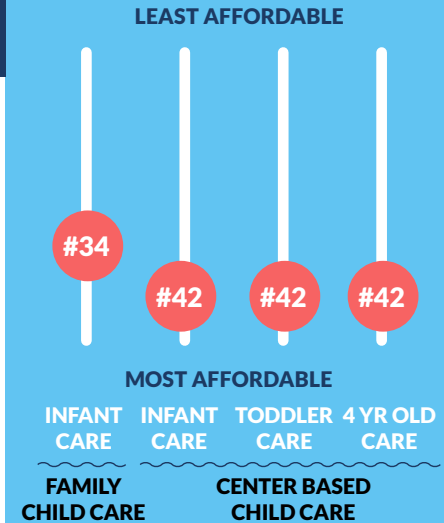


In Ohio, the median income for a single-parent family is \$25,487, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **40%** of family median income.

In Ohio, the median income for a married couple is \$98,574, which means center-based child care for an infant would use **10%** of family median income.



When ranked among other states on the affordability of care:



Compared to tuition and housing...



In Ohio, the average price of infant care in a center-based program is **12.93% less** than the average tuition and fees at an in-state, four-year public university.



In Ohio, the average price for two children in center-based child care is **90.43% more** than the average annualized rent cost and **20.02% more** than the average annualized mortgage cost.
